James Darrell Tallman, Jr., 78, of Stephens City died Thursday, October 12, 2017 in Blue Ridge Hospice Inpatient Care Center.

Mr. Tallman was born June 10, 1939 in Fairmont, WV the son of James Sr., and Ruth Ours Tallman Shuster.

Professionally, he was a sales associate for Grand Home Furnishings of Winchester for 12 years and for Sears & Roebuck Company for 28 years. After leaving Sears, he served as business manager for Kern Motor Company and was a sales associate for Montgomery Ward.

He served in the Army National Guard for 6 years having attained the rank of Staff Sergeant and received an honorable discharge. He attended Lord Fairfax Community College after graduating from Handley High School in 1958.

He was also an avid photographer and was an original co-founder of the Shenandoah Photographic Society and a member of the Board of Directors of the Winchester Chamber Orchestra.
