



Terri Watson Chapman

February 19, 1938 - June 3, 2013

Terri W Chapman, after a long struggle, succumbed to complications from Parkinson's Disease on June 3, 2013.

Born in Elizabeth City, NC on Feb 19, 1938 to John and Mildred Watson she became a registered nurse specializing in orthopedic and emergency medicine upon graduation from Fayetteville Technical College.

She relocated to Northern VA in August 1979 and worked for Dr's Levine and Foley (team physicians for the Washington Redskins and the Washington Bullets). In 1989 she moved to Winchester, VA and started working at Warren Memorial Hospital in Front Royal, VA in the Emergency Room eventually transferring to the Cardiac Rehab facility prior to her retirement due to Parkinson's Disease.

She is survived by Jim Chapman, husband of 34 years, her daughter Sandra Clair Franco, Bristow, VA, her son David N Jackson, Greenville NC and her son Clayton Todd Jackson, Burlington IA. Other survivors include 7 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren and two Westies, Willie and Scout. When she crossed over Rainbow Bridge Terri was met by a loving group of five Westies, two Cairn Terriers and a Tibetan Terrier, all of whom used to live with her.

When not working Terri worked as a volunteer with Westie Rescue where she assisted in the rescue, rehabilitation and rehoming of an average of 100 West Highland White Terriers each year. At other times she filled her leisure time with counted cross stitch and needlepoint activities including exhibiting at the famed Woodlawn Plantation Needlework show near Mount Vernon, VA

The family will receive visitors at the Phelps Funeral Chapel at 311 Hope Drive, Winchester, VA between the hours of 7 pm to 9 pm on Friday June 7, 2013. Funeral services will be held at the Phelps Funeral Chapel, 311 Hope Drive, Winchester, VA at 11 am on Saturday June 8, 2013 with Rev. Garry Smith officiating.

Interment will be at Mount Hebron immediately following the service.
