William Arthur Dillon, 83, of Winchester, died Saturday, July 28, 2012 in Blue Ridge Hospice Residential Center.

He was born July 31, 1928 in Canton, OH the son of Willis and Elizabeth Steen Dillon.

He married Thelma Moore in 1961.

Mr. Dillon graduated from Carrollton High School in Carrollton, OH May 28, 1946. He served in the US Army from June 28, 1946 until June 27, 1948. He graduated from the University of Toledo College of Pharmacy in June 1952.

Mr. Dillon was chief pharmacist for twenty-one years at Winchester Memorial Hospital which later became Winchester Medical Center. He then founded Valley Pharmacy at the medical center and served as pharmacist in charge for five years. He worked in several pharmacy positions almost until the time of his demise.

Mr. Dillon was a member of and sang baritone with the Apple Capital Chorus.

Surviving are his wife; a sister, Dorothy McLaughlin of Cleveland, OH and five devoted nieces, Kathleen McLaughlin of Cleveland, Sally Williams and her

husband Cliff of Massillon, OH, Laura Bishop and her husband Andy of Delaware, OH and Cynthia Erwin and her husband Jon and Nancy Dillon all of Tucson, AR.

A brother, Robert Willis Dillon is deceased.
